

ACADEMIC MAINSTREAM PROGRAMME



Junior School

Central to the Academic Programme in the Junior School are the following core subjects: taught by class teachers -

English: The Junior School English Curriculum consists of three components: Speaking and Listening, Reading and Viewing, Writing. The English curriculum at All Saints is in line with the National Profile Statement.

Mathematics: The Junior School Mathematics curriculum consists of five major components: Number, Measurement, Chance and Data, Space and working mathematically.

Studies of Society: The Study of Society and Environment begins in Prep where students commence the acquisition of knowledge, skills and values/attitudes encompassed within the SOSE Curriculum.

Specialist Staff support the following areas:

Art:

Visual Art lessons are held weekly for a period of 60 minutes from Prep to Year 6.

Students are encouraged to express themselves freely in a visual form with focus given to building confidence and self-esteem.

Christian Living:

Amongst our Junior School students, Gospel values are shared by loving example and encouragement. Informal Chapel services occur from Years 3-6.

Languages Other Than English:

Foreign languages commence at Year 6 level. Year 6 children participate in Chinese (Mandarin), French and Japanese.

Music:

Each class in the Junior School participates in two half hour sessions of class Music each week. Students in Year 3 learn the violin as part of our programme while Year 5 students have the opportunity to learn woodwind, keyboard, brass or percussion instruments as an integral part of their lessons. Choirs, orchestras, bands and ensembles are also offered to Junior School students.

Physical Education:

A healthy mind, healthy body is the cornerstone of our Physical Education programme. Students from Years P - 6 participate in a Physical Education programme that includes swimming, athletics, cross country, minor and major games as well as the perceptual motor programme for younger students. Inter school sport occurs for Year 4-6 as part of the Associated Private Schools competition.



Science and Technology:

All Saints Anglican School has long been a leader in technological innovation. All classes have two computers in each room while at the Years 5 and 6 level there are 10 desk top computers and purpose built furniture. The computers are all part of the School's network and have access to CD stacks and the Internet.



Complimenting our in-class programme, Junior School children from Years P to 6 participate in Technology activities in our Technology Centre. This programme encompasses the exploration of Multi Media, Control Systems, Robotics and traditional construction materials. The emphasis in Technology lessons centres on the motto "Design, Make, Appraise".

Speech and Drama:

Speech and Drama is a co-curricular subject available to Junior School students in Years 3 - 6. It aims to develop students both personally and artistically through classroom activities and performance opportunities.



Middle School



During the middle years of schooling at All Saints, students undertake studies in the following leaning areas.

- · Music, Visual Arts, Speech and Drama
- English
- Personal and Physical Development
- Mathematics
- Science
- Languages: French, Japanese and Chinese (Mandarin)
- Studies of Society and Environment
- Food Science and Technology
- Educational Computing and Technology
- Christian Living

Each subject area places emphasis on:

- communication skills
- social skills and an understanding of the values, attitudes and practices which contribute to a Christian society
- planning and design skills and an understanding of the role of goal setting, reasoning, aesthetic judgement and imagination
- making good use of time and resources and ordering and monitoring tasks
- recognising the need for information, to know how and where to find information from a range of sources and how to evaluate, select and use it
- an understanding and appreciation of our environment
- technology as a tool to help access, manage, process and communicate information and to enable, engage and empower students in their learning
- the attitudes, knowledge, skills and work practices of an effective team



Senior School



The Secondary School curriculum builds upon the solid foundations laid by the academic programme offered in the Junior and Middle Schools.

Year 10

All students are required to study Maths, English, Christian Living and Physical Education. The remaining key learning areas of Science, Studies of Science and Environment, The Arts. Technology and Languages other than English are covered from a range of elective units. Over the course of Year 10 students will choose a total of sixteen electives, each of one term duration.

Senior Secondary

Towards the end of Year 10 students are required to choose a course of study for Years 11 and 12. Various options are available.

- Students choose to study six Board of Senior Secondary School Studies (BSSSS) subjects. The aim is to achieve an OP (Overall Position) that will enable them to embark on the tertiary course of their choice.
- Students choose a combination of BSSSS subjects and Vocational Education courses.
 By choosing this combination, students may elect to go onto further study at a Tertiary level (University or TAFE) through gaining a Tertiary Entrance Ranking, or take on an apprenticeship or move directly into the workforce.
- Students study purely Vocational Education courses, aiming to complete one or more certificates. Studying this course allows students to commence Trade Certificates and move into work/part-time study at the post secondary level.
- School Based Traineeships are also available to all students at Senior Secondary level.
 This enables students to undertake training and paid work in their chosen career field whilst still completing their Senior Certificate at school.

Students participating in any Vocational Education course are encouraged to undertaken structured workplace learning as part of their Senior School studies.

A stand alone course in Hospitality is offered by the School as a Registered Training Provider. The course offers Certificates I and II in Cookery and Food & Beverage.

At the successful completion of the course, students will have developed sufficient skills to gain employment in the Hospitality Industry.

Opportunities exist for students to take on part-time Traineeships/Apprenticeships in conjunction with their studies. A Commercial Kitchen and Training Restaurant with Bar facilities enables students to gain "hands on" experience as they develop essential skills.

Tourism: Computer Studies, Industrial Skills, English Communication

- Should cancellation be made prior to 30 days before Semester commencement, a fee
 equal to (1) one term's Tuition and Boarding/Homestay fees will be retained.
- Should cancellation be made less than 30 days prior to Semester commencement, a fee equal to (1) one semester (ie two terms) of the Tuition and Boarding/Homestay fees will be retained.
- Should cancellation be made after 30 days of Semester commencement, no refund will be given.
- If our institution is unable to deliver the course in which the student has enrolled, 100%

EXPERIENCE YEAR



Each year All Saints Anglican School has limited spaces for students from abroad to undertake either a semester or a year as a high school student in Australia. Programmes start in January, April and July of each year. The programme provides students from outside Australia to experience first-hand the culture, language and customs of Australia. Students attend high school daily and are involved in the co-curricular and club life of the School. English language support is available throughout the year.

Students should be at least 13 years of age and have above average results from the school in their homeland. Where possible, All Saints will arrange a home stay family with a student of similar age to that of the overseas student. Alternatively, students may choose to live in the School Dormitory, located within the School campus. Multi-lingual staff members are available to counsel and assist students throughout the year.

Currently we have staff who speak French, German, Portuguese, Japanese and Chinese.

Students from France, Belgium, Germany, Japan and Brazil have participated in this programme previously. Students select a range of subjects, however, a student may not graduate under the Queensland system of education at the conclusion of this programme. At the end of the semester or year, students receive a school report confirming that they have lived and studied at All Saints.

- International students who attend All Saints may choose to live with an Australian "Homestay" family or in the School Dormitory – International House.
- International House has modern facilities including 20 twin-share rooms.
- All students have access to the internet/email and private telephone and voice mail facilities within their own rooms.
- In the dormitory dining room we offer a variety of both Western and Eastern cuisine to satisfy students of all nationalities.



THE HIGH SCHOOL PREPARATION PROGRAMME



The High School Preparation Programme is an intensive English language course designed to assist international students gain the knowledge and skills necessary to undertake high school in Australia. Students aged between 12 and 17 years of age will be considered for enrolment.

The well-qualified English as a Second Language teachers have experience in intensive English language courses and up-to-date knowledge of the high school curriculum across a broad range of subject areas.

The programme has three broad levels and students enter at the level appropriate to their language ability. Students improve their general English while focussing on the language strategies and skills required to complete high school classroom tasks. Small classes ensure all students receive the individual attention they require.

Individual student needs are catered for at all levels and excursions to places of interest are organised as reinforcement of the content of the programme. In addition, students in the highest level class also participate in some high school classes.

Reports are issued to parents at the end of each Semester.


